



# Angola solar electricity system

How much solar energy does Angola have?

**SOLAR ENERGY:** 100 MW UNTIL 2025 Angola has a high solar resource potential, with an annual average global horizontal radiation between 1.350 and 2.070 kWh/m<sup>2</sup>/year. Solar energy constitutes the largest and more uniformly distributed renewable resource of the country.

Is Angola developing a solar power project?

Angola is currently developing several solar power projects that tie in to the country's Angola Energy programme and its environmental commitments. Among current developments is a mega-project consisting of seven photovoltaic plants that will be commissioned by Q2 2023 and additional projects funded by the Angolan and US governments.

Will Angola get 60% electricity by 2025?

Angola has set a target of 60% access to electricity by 2025 under the strategic plan 'Visao 2025,' of which solar is poised to play a central role. Supporting electrification as well as diversification, solar projects are being rolled out by the government alongside international partners and project developers.

What makes Angola a good country for solar power?

Abundant sunshine, high solar radiation levels and a low electrification rate make Angola conducive to the development of solar photovoltaic power. The country's first solar power plants - located in Bié and Bafinda - were inaugurated in July 2022 and will supply electricity to 1.5 million households.

Will a 150 MW solar plant help Angola?

An agreement for the development of a 150 MW solar plant was signed between Angola's Ministry of Energy and Water and UAE-based renewable energy company Masdar in Dubai last December. The 150 MW project will produce electricity to power 90,000 homes, contributing to job creation, emissions reduction and efforts to increase national electrification.

What is the current electricity rate in Angola?

While the current national electrification rate is below 50%, the country has plans to increase this to 60% by 2025, on the back of clean energy development. Angola is home to abundant sunshine for much of the year, with a global annual horizontal solar radiation estimated between 1,370 and 2,100 kWh per cubic meter per year.

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Portugal's MCA, in partnership with Angola's Ministry of Energy and Water, has inaugurated a 25.3-MWp solar photovoltaic park in Angola's Moxico province. The Luena Photovoltaic Park, built at a cost of EUR 36.9 million, consists of 43,680 solar panels and is capable of providing electricity to 59,483 people.

The average cost of solar panels in Angola is about \$20,500 for a 5-kW system and \$41,000 for a 10-kW system before the ITC, but the actual cost will depend on things like the type of solar panels you want, what size system you need and how much energy you consume.

The projects will be installed in the Moxico, Lunda Norte, Lunda Sul, Bie, and Malanje provinces, adding 296 MW of solar capacity and 719 MWh of battery energy storage system to the Angolan grid. The facilities will provide electricity to power one million consumers. Clean energy firm MCA Group has been tasked with the construction of the projects.

The Angolan government is also seeking financing for energy dispatch centers to monitor production,

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transmission, and distribution by controlling inflows and outflows of electricity throughout the system. The African Development Bank (AFDB) approved a US\$ 530 million line of credit for energy infrastructure in Angola.
