

Cost of 1 gw solar power plant Tuvalu

How much energy does Tuvalu use a year?

Like many Small Island Developing States (SIDS), Tuvalu has been heavily reliant on imported fuel for its diesel-based power generation system. Through this new FSPV system 174.2 megawatts per hour of electricity will be generated each year, meeting two percent of Funafuti's annual energy demand.

What is the Tuvalu solar power project?

The Government of Tuvalu worked with the e8 group to develop the Tuvalu Solar Power Project, which is a 40 kW grid-connected solar system that is intended to provide about 5% of Funafuti's peak demand, and 3% of the Tuvalu Electricity Corporation's annual household consumption.

Where does Tuvalu electricity come from?

Tuvalu's power has come from electricity generation facilities that use imported diesel brought in by ships. The Tuvalu Electricity Corporation (TEC) on the main island of Funafuti operates the large power station (2000 kW).

What is Tuvalu's energy plan?

Tuvalu has two stated goals: o To generate electricity with 100% renewable energy by 2020 o To increase energy efficiency on Funafuti by 30%. The Plan is intended for use by the Government of Tuvalu (GoT), the Tuvalu Electricity Corporation (TEC), potential donors, community representatives and other relevant stakeholders.

What was the first large scale solar system in Tuvalu?

The first large scale system in Tuvalu was a 40 kW solar panel installation on the roof of Tuvalu Sports Ground. This grid-connected 40 kW solar system was established in 2008 by the E8 and Japan Government through Kansai Electric Company (Japan) and contributes 1% of electricity production on Funafuti.

Who uses the Tuvalu electricity plan?

The Plan is intended for use by the Government of Tuvalu (GoT), the Tuvalu Electricity Corporation (TEC), potential donors, community representatives and other relevant stakeholders. It is a working document and will be regularly reviewed and updated as new information becomes available.

New Zealand renewable energy company Infratec has won a \$NZ8.4 million contract with the Tuvalu Electricity Corporation (TEC) that will help the tiny island nation of Tuvalu towards its goal of 100% renewable electricity.

In terms of the unit cost per kWh, solar power generation in Tuvalu is almost equivalent to diesel power generation. ? While a dramatic reduction in the cost of diesel power generation is not anticipated, the cost of solar power generation has been more than halved in the past 10 years and is expected to continue to decrease.

The initial capital cost of solar arrays, wind turbines and batteries to replace the current energy demand is estimated to be A\$52 million. Currently Tuvalu is using 1.76 million litres of diesel fuel per year at a cost of A\$1.50/litre, most of which is used to generate electricity.
