

Does Somalia have solar energy potential?

How much sunshine does Somalia get a year?

The average sunshine duration in Somalia ranges from 2900 to 3100 h per year, averaging 8-8.5 h per day. The surrounding temperature, with a yearly average of 27 °C, is suitable for the operational life of PV systems.
