Where are the Turks and Caicos Islands located?

The Turks and Caicos Islands (abbreviated TCI; /tʔ:rkʂ /and /'keIkʂs,- koʂs,- kʂs /) are a British Overseas Territory consisting of the larger Caicos Islands and smaller Turks Islands,two groups of tropical islands in the Lucayan Archipelago of the Atlantic Ocean and northern West Indies.

Who inhabited the Turks & Caicos?

Long before Christopher Columbus first set foot on the capital island of Grand Turk during his discovery voyage of the new world in 1492,the islands of the Turks and Caicos were inhabited by Taino and Lucayan peoples. These original settlers left a rich heritage of seafaring,salt raking and farming,which still lingers on today.

Are Turks & Caicos a self governing territory?

The Turks and Caicos Islands participate in the Caribbean Development Bank,is an associate in CARICOM,a member of the Universal Postal Union and maintains an Interpol sub-bureau. The United Nations Special Committee on Decolonization includes the territory on the United Nations list of non-self-governing territories.

Why were the Turks and Caicos contested?

Although the islands were unpopulated,weren't especially valued,and considering that there were few natural resources,the ownership of the Turks and Caicos was contested by the European powers at the time. A blue hole underwater cave system at an inland saline pond in the Turks and Caicos.

Why did the Bermudians come to Turks and Caicos?

Bermudians came to Turks and Caicos to rake the salt and take it back to Bermuda. Salt was a precious commodity back then as it was used for preserving food. The shallow waters surrounding the islands were ideal for salt raking but treacherous for nautical navigation and more than 1000 ships were wrecked during the journey to and from.

How did Caicos Island get its name?

These earlier settlers left behind a rich heritage and new words (canoe,Caribbean,Caicos) and the names of the island. The indigenous Turk's head cactus named Turks island,while the Lucayan term "caya hico",meaning string of islands,was mangled to become "Caicos".

The Turks and Caicos Islands is a British Overseas Territory located in the North Atlantic, and is composed of two island groups: the Turks Islands and the Caicos Islands. There are eight major islands, of which six are inhabited.

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Turks and Caicos Islands, overseas territory of the United Kingdom in the West Indies. It consists of two groups of islands lying on the southeastern periphery of The Bahamas, of which they form a physical part, and north of the island of Hispaniola. The islands include eight large cays (keys) and numerous smaller cays, islets, reefs, banks ...

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The Turks and Caicos Islands is a British Overseas Territory, located in the Atlantic Ocean and considered a part of the Caribbean region. With more than 40 small islands and cays, the nine inhabited islands are separated into two island groups; to the east of the Turks Island Passage are the Turks Islands and the west are the Caicos Islands.

Largely due to the expansive Ramsar conservation site off the south of North Caicos, Middle Caicos and East Caicos, the Turks and Caicos Islands collectively have almost 200,000 acres (800 km²;) of protected nature reserves, national parks, and historical sites. This equates to about 44% of land in the country.

The Turks and Caicos Islands are only about 60 km (37 miles) long, and consist of over 40 islands and cays.
